COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

Biographical Note

A New York City native, Paul Brooks (1909-1998) earned an A.B. cum laude from Harvard University in 1931. He worked as the editor of the Harvard Lampoon, later becoming a trustee. After graduating, Brooks was offered a position as an editorial reader at the Boston Houghton Mifflin Publishing Company. He accepted, and rose through the editorial ranks, eventually becoming editor-in-chief and a director in 1943, and then a vice president of the company. He worked for the publishing house for 40 years, and was editor-in-chief of the General Book Department for twenty-five years, during which time he edited works by Winston Churchill, Rachel Carson, and Roger Tory Peterson. Brooks was also a prolific writer in his own right and published several books related to nature: *Roadless Area* (1971), *The Pursuit of Wilderness* (1971), *The View from Lincoln Hill: Man and the Land in a New England Town* (1976), *Speaking for Nature: How Literary Naturalists from Henry Thoreau to Rachel Carson Have Shaped America* (1980), *The Old Manse and the People Who Lived There* (1983), *Two Park Street: a Publishing Memoir* (1986), *The House of Life: Rachel Carson at Work* (1989), and *The People of Concord: One Year in the Flowering of New England* (1990). A passionate environmental activist, Brooks traveled extensively with his wife, Susan (Susie), and took leadership roles in numerous organizations, such as the Sierra Club and Massachusetts Audubon Society. He was asked to lecture all over the United States throughout his career. In recognition of his work, Brooks was awarded the John Burroughs Medal, the Sierra Club's John Muir Medal, the Thoreau Society Medal, the National Audubon Society's Hal Borland Award, and an honorary doctorate by the University of Massachusetts.

Scope and Content Note

The collection documents Brooks' role as an environmental activist, a writer, and an editor. Materials are mainly textual, consisting of news clippings, manuscripts for books written by Brooks, correspondence, diaries, and other printed matter. Other formats include photographs, artwork (mostly pen and ink, and pencil), and awards (medals and plaques) that Brooks has been given throughout his lifetime.
